# **Grade 5 Theory Needed**

## These topics are covered in the Intermediate (grade 5) Theory Course

You should be able to recognise, notate (write correctly) and use the items below.

## 1. Rhythm

- a) <u>time signatures</u>, and changes of time signature
- b) correct grouping of notes and rests
- c) double-dotted notes and rests
- d) breves, triplets (including semiquavers) and duplets (tuplets)

#### 2. Scales and chords

- a) scales of all major and minor keys (including harmonic and melodic minor scales)
- b) names of degrees of the scale (e.g. mediant, submediant, leading note)
- c) key signatures of all major and minor keys
- d) types of chords (including aug., dim., and dim. 7th chords)
- e) chords on every degree of the scale using numerals (e.g. vii°)
- f) "jazz" / "guitar" chord symbols
- g) inversions of chords

### 3. Other

- a) alto and tenor clefs
- b) transpositions for clarinet in A, horn in F, trumpet in B flat
- c) closed and open score
- d) all intervals including compound intervals (10ths / compound 3rds)
- e) <u>ornaments</u> mordents, appoggiaturas, grace notes, arpeggios
